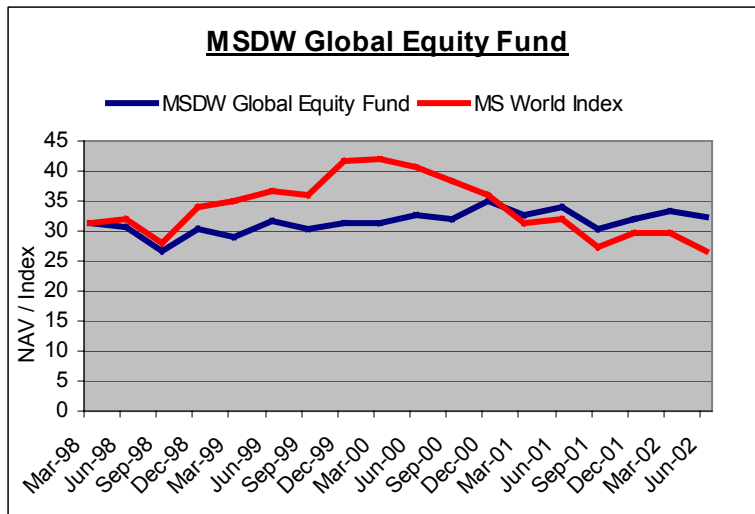
Investment Philosophy

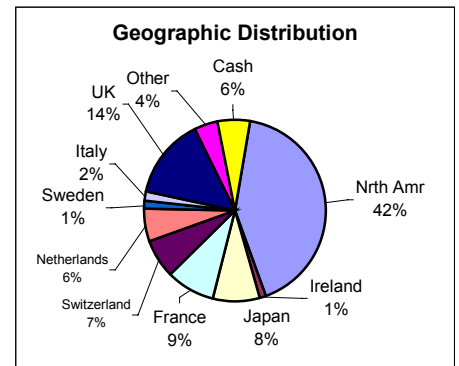
