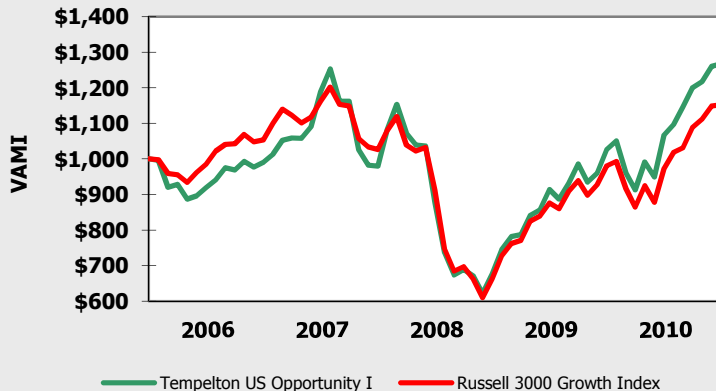

Growth of \$1,000



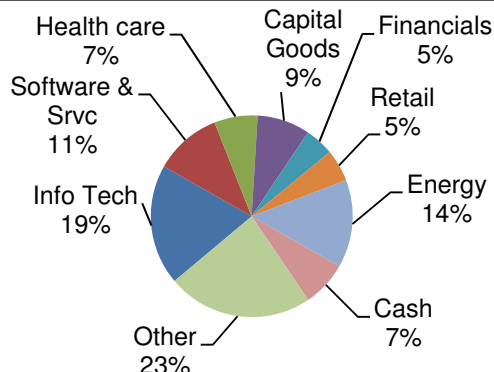

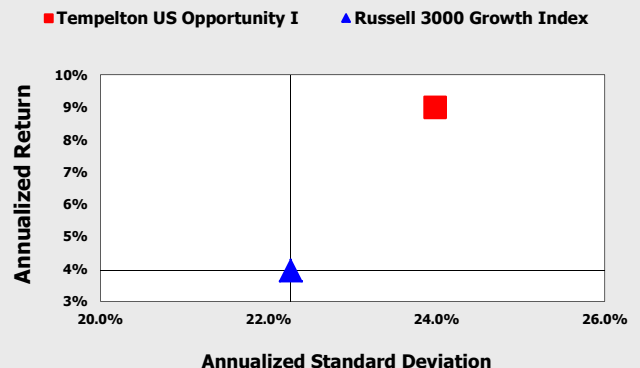
